- The spoken and unspoken thoughts that say, "What are we supposed to do now?"

Rarely in our lifetimes has the entire world been gripped by hopelessness all at once like it is right now. It's definitely challenging, frustrating and at times downright disheartening. But as followers of Christ, we have something that the world needs right now...

The HOPE that comes in Jesus Christ!

This past Sunday, as we celebrated Easter online together, I kicked off a **brand new, seven-week message series** called **"HOPE: Jesus is the Answer."**

In this series, we're digging into the person of Jesus Christ by looking at the seven "I Am" statements that He makes about Himself in the gospel of John. We'll look at how each of these statements brings a powerful and unique remedy to the hopelessness in our world today.

The topic last Sunday was "Hope... When It All Goes Wrong," and we looked at how Jesus' declaration that He is the Resurrection and the Life gives us the remedy to when it all goes wrong in this fallen world.
