EASTER - Like No Other Day

This Sunday is the most important day on our Christian calendar each year, Easter Sunday. In fact, the resurrection marks the turning point of all human history. It gives us an opportunity to celebrate God's fulfilled promise to redeem us from our sins and give us a new life in Christ!

With that in mind – and understanding the unique circumstances surrounding Easter this year – I want to share with you a few recommendations to help prepare to make the most of Easter Sunday 2020.

Pray Daily

- Pray to thank the Lord for His sacrifice on Easter. Thank God for sending His Son to die for you and for overcoming the grave.
- Pray for God's peace for His people during this challenging time.
- Pray for those who are far from God during this difficult season. Ask Him to draw them near and allow them to hear and respond to the message of Jesus Christ this weekend.
- Pray for opportunities this week to scatter seeds of the Gospel to those you interact with this week.

Reflect on Holy Week

While we are limited on how we can walk through Holy Week together this year, this is a great time to remember and reflect on what took place in Jesus' life in the days leading up to Easter Sunday.

Confess, Repent & Reconcile

- Confess and ask forgiveness from God for any lingering sin in your life. Remember that Christ died to set you free from the grip of sin.
- Repent of any ongoing, habitual sins that you've been struggling with. Remember, repentance is a change of heart that leads to a change in behavior, turning away from sin and back to the Lord.
- Consider whether there's anything you need to do to reconcile with the people in your life. Scripture guides us to live at peace with everyone, as much as it depends on us.

By taking these steps and aligning our hearts again with Christ's redeeming work on the cross, you'll be better prepared to fully participate in our online, corporate worship service on Sunday.
