

DAILY BIBLE TOOLS

This past Sunday I began a new Sunday teaching series called, *“Daily: Practices toward Christian Progress,”* and in it, we’re examining four ancient Christian practices or habits that will help us grow spiritually, become more like Christ, and experience God’s best in our lives.

In the first message of this series, I shared the importance of developing (or deepening) a daily, personal Bible habit. This includes reading, studying, meditating and memorizing, and applying God’s Word.

I wanted to take this week’s article to share a few resources and further thoughts to equip you in your daily Bible habit.

First, I mentioned what an advantage it is for us to live in today’s world when it comes to regular Bible study. To begin with, up until a few centuries ago the idea of having your own Bible was a fantasy, much less the abundance of translations and resources available to us now.

Speaking of Bible translations, I often preach on Sundays from the New King James Version (NKJV) and supplement that in my personal reading with the New Living Translation (NLT), which is written in more common, everyday language.

Beyond the abundance of Bible translations, we now have access to concordances (for word studies), dictionaries (for biblical definitions), commentaries (for other people’s insights), and more, literally at our fingertips.

Here are just a few resources to equip you for your everyday Bible habit:

- **YouVersion Bible Apps** – The Bible App and Bible App for Kids are available for free from the app store on your phone or tablet. You’ll find virtually any translation of the Bible and hundreds of free Bible reading plans.
- **BibleStudyTools.com** – Another free resource, this website provides multiple Bible translations, as well as commentaries, concordances, dictionaries, and even Greek and Hebrew tools for deeper study.
- **Logos Bible Software** – If you’re interested in a more comprehensive set of tools for your Bible study, Logos.com has a variety of packages (for different budgets) that provide the tools discussed already in one integrated software. You can check them out at www.logos.com.

These are just three of the tools that I find most useful in my daily Bible habit – reading, studying, mediating & memorizing, and applying. Regardless of whether you use any of these or just your trusty printed Bible, the key is to make it a part of your life... daily!
