LET'S START OFF STRONG

We have begun a new Sunday message series called “REBUILD: Lessons from the Book of Nehemiah,” and this past Sunday I shared the importance of starting a rebuild with enthusiasm and energy to be effective.

Right now at FBC, we’re embarking on a rebuild of sorts – seeking to cooperate with God to become the church He desires us to be. To that end, now is a good time to remember what a “great,” rebuilt FBC Garden City would look like (all from the words of Jesus):

The Great Commandment:

“You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.” This is the first and greatest commandment. A second is equally important: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments.”

– Matthew 22:36-40 (NLT)

The Great Commission:

“I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age.” – Matthew 28:18-20 (NLT)

The Great Compassion:

“Then the King will say to those on his right, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world. For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me.’” ... “And the King

will say, ‘I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!’” – Matthew 25:34-36, 40 (NLT)

These three “great” statements give us some clarity on our goal of what kind of church the Lord is rebuilding around here – and it’s necessary to know where we’re going if we are to start off strong!

To state it clearly and concisely, we might say that our vision for FBC Garden City is:


To be an authentic and passionate community of Christ followers, loving God, loving people, and lighting the way.
