WHAT'S NEXT?

Last Sunday, we finished up our *REBUILD* teaching series with a message about studying the results. The premise was that even when one specific job or task is completed in God's Kingdom, the work isn't done. If you're still on Earth, **He's not done with you yet.**

We talked about the importance of steadying up whatever has been done and making plans for a lasting impact. Nehemiah set up his succession plan, put systems in place, took inventory of the people, and re-aligned them with God's Word.

Your preparation for His next steps depends on the type of project you've been working on – maybe it means setting up some healthy boundaries in your rebuilt relationships or putting together a long-term plan for financial success after a career rebuild. Just remember that God is in favor of planning... as long as we're willing to follow where He leads.

Another part of evaluating the end of a project or a season of life involves intentionally giving God the glory for what He's done. Whatever area of life you've seen Him working on, it's important for us to take time to give Him credit and thank Him for all He has done. This serves two purposes: 1) it shines the light on the One who is our source, and 2) it reminds us of our dependence on Him!

We've got to also be sure to engage our generosity when we're finishing up something for God. Unfortunately, our human nature has a tendency toward "looking out for number one," and often the completion of a season of life or a specific rebuild gives just enough margin for us to lean back into that pull toward selfishness. Our generosity of time, abilities, and

finances forces us to look beyond our own needs and stay focused on others.

Perhaps the most important step to take when one chapter comes to an end is to prayerfully consider what God has in store for us to do next.


Although I didn't always agree with the politics of the show, I was a fan of the TV show, "The West Wing," that was popular some years back. One of my favorite character traits of the President on that show was his refrain after every challenge had been dealt with. Whether it was working to fund relief for a natural disaster, brokering a peace deal, passing a budget, or anything else that they handled in his office, the following words were soon heard:

"What's Next?"

Whether you appreciate the source or not, the principle is correct. Too often we – as individuals, families, even churches – get so caught up reflecting back on times gone by that we miss out on God's next assignment for us. That's not to say there isn't time to celebrate and rest, as both are essential. Instead, just remember that God still has you on assignment and your life's work isn't yet completed.

How do we discern what's next? We look for where God is already at work and we join Him there. So, keep your eyes peeled and your ears open for what God is up to... then roll up your sleeves and get involved!
