Who Am I?

This past Sunday, our message was about God and Government, and our role as Christians living in the United States. In case you missed it, you can go and watch/listen at FBCGC.live. A recurring theme in this message (and a couple of others recently) was the idea of identity – allowing my identity as a follower of Jesus to define you, your thoughts, and your actions.

Here's why this is so important: If I see myself as a Republican or Democrat who happens to be a Christian, my priorities flow out of what's best for "the party," rather than what is best for the Kingdom of God. On the contrary, if I see myself as a Christian first, I can prayerfully discern how to vote and whom to support based on how they align with God's Word.

The same is true for every other identifier we choose to place before Christ in our lives, whether it is race, gender, occupation, socioeconomic status, geographic identity, or anything else... If any of these are the primary way you see yourself, whether you realize it or not, it is affecting your thoughts, words, and actions.

In fact, Jesus gives us clear instructions what our priorities should be if we claim to follow Him:

"Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need." – Matthew 6:33 (NLT)

Notice the two non-negotiables when it comes to Christ-ordained priorities: 1) *Seek God's Kingdom first and foremost*, and 2) *Live righteously*. And the conditional result of this verse is equally impactful because He says if we'll do that – focus our attention on these first priorities – *He will provide everything else we need*. What a great promise!

The Christian walk is (and has always been) a counter-cultural way of life. The idea that you and I will identify ourselves as followers of Jesus first – above all the other identifiers that could be applied – and allow that identity to inform all of our steps is, for lack of a better word, *weird*. And that's OK. I'd much rather be weird in the world's eyes and pleasing in God's eyes than the other way around.


The Apostle Peter describes for us this counter-cultural identity, comparing how those who reject Jesus' message ("they") live to how those of us who follow Christ ("you") are to live:

"They stumble because they do not obey God's word, and so they meet the fate that was planned for them.

But you are not like that, for you are a chosen people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own possession. As a result, you can show others the goodness of God, for he called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light." – 1 Peter 2:8-9 (NLT)

When you and I step into our role as royal priests, a holy nation, and God's own possession, He will use us to show others His goodness!
