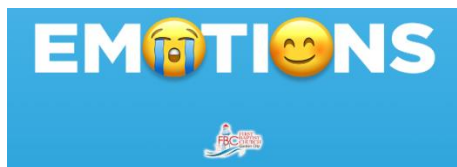

March 14: Navigating Uncertainty

UNCERTAIN TIMES...

I pray this newsletter finds you healthy, safe, and hopeful, as March is almost half-way through and the celebration of Easter looms brightly just a few weeks away (more on that later). On Sundays, we have been working through a series of messages on *EMOTIONS*, looking at the emotions God wired us to feel, how we see them experienced in the Bible, and how we can learn to use them for God's glory... even the ones that are sometimes a little tricky.

Last week we looked at how to be angry like Jesus, focusing mainly on checking ourselves in four areas when we sense ourselves getting angry:

- 1) What is prompting my anger?
- 2) What is my immediate response?
- 3) What are my next steps after the initial incident?
- 4) Am I devoting myself to model Jesus' commitment to love, above all?

This Sunday we're turning to a topic that has defined most of our lives for almost exactly one year as of this week... UNCERTAINTY. In fact, the title of Sunday's message is "*Navigating Uncertainty*," because just finding our way during seasons like this can be overwhelmingly difficult.


Speaking of seasons like this, we are in the midst of what I believe is a crucible experience for us as followers of Jesus and His church, where the heat and pressure of circumstance is refining and shaping us. Only after time passes and we look back will we be able to completely assess everything that has changed and that which is still the same.

But even in the midst of the uncertain times, there are foundational truths to which we can cling. God Himself – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – never changes. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. We can bank on His character and His track record... even when we doubt everyone else (including ourselves).

We can trust the Bible, God's direct revelation to us, because it never changes or goes out of date. It's living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword. And we can depend on the truths and promises that it contains. In fact, starting on Easter Sunday, we are going to spend eight weeks studying "*God's Amazing Promises*."

As a reminder, **Easter Sunday, April 4, is less than 4 weeks away**. It's going to be a powerful celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. I'm excited and I hope you are, too! We will have our regular Sunday in-person service time (11:00am) and, for the first time, we will have multiple service times available online at FBCGC.live. So, please make plans now to attend (either in-person or online) and begin today praying about and inviting your friends, family, co-workers, and neighbors to Easter @ FBC. I can't wait to see what God has in store!
