1. E _____ ME TO LIVE AT _____.

“‘There is no peace,’ says the Lord, ‘for the wicked.’” – Isaiah 48:22 (NKJV)

“But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed.” – Isaiah 53:5 (NKJV)

“For God in all his fullness was pleased to live in Christ, and through him God reconciled everything to himself. He made peace with everything in heaven and on earth by means of Christ’s blood on the cross.”
– Colossians 1:19-20 (NLT)

2. E _____ TO PEACE.

“‘I create the fruit of the lips: Peace, peace to him who is far off and to him who is near,’ says the Lord, ‘And I will heal him.’” – Isaiah 47:19 (NKJV)

“For Christ himself has brought peace to us. He united Jews and Gentiles into one people when, in his own body on the cross, he broke down the wall of hostility that separated us. He did this by ending the system of law with its commandments and regulations. He made peace between Jews and Gentiles by creating in himself one new people from the two groups. Together as one body, Christ reconciled both groups to God by means of his death on the cross, and our hostility toward each other was put to death.”

– Ephesians 2:14-16 (NLT)

“He brought this Good News of peace to you Gentiles who were far away from him, and peace to the Jews who were near. Now all of us can come to the Father through the same Holy Spirit because of what Christ has done for us.” – Ephesians 2:17-18 (NLT)

3. E _____ ME TO _____ WITH OTHERS.

“If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men.” – Romans 12:18 (NKJV)

(Jesus) *“Therefore if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, 24 leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift.”* – Matthew 5:23-24 (NKJV)

(Jesus) *“If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back. But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses...”*

– Matthew 18:15-16 (NLT)

4. E _____ A _____ TO EACH OF HIS FOLLOWERS.

(Jesus) *“Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.”* – John 14:27 (NKJV)

“Don’t worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. 7 Then you will experience God’s peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.” – Philippians 4:6-7 (NLT)
