PASS IT ON

When I was younger, I had no intention of becoming a pastor. My father was a pastor and I got to see "behind-the-scenes" of both the positive and negative of what that entailed. I could tell it was rewarding, but it looked like a lot of work!

So, in college I studied business and computer science and started a small business in my dorm room, thinking I'd be the next Steve Jobs or [insert your favorite tech millionaire]. Well, the millions didn't quite come like I'd hoped, but the work was rewarding.

Something happened about six years into that career... God changed my heart. My weekend travels left me wishing I was home to be with my church family. The joy of helping local businesses get started on the internet began to fade. In short, the Lord was calling me into something new and different; He was calling me into pastoral ministry.

My home church brought me on staff as their Student Pastor, but shortly thereafter, our Senior Pastor resigned. Now I was left with some great men who were helping to lead, but none of us had ever been a pastor. In stepped a great friend of mine (also a pastor) who took Paul's words to heart from 2 Timothy 2:2:

"You have heard me teach things that have been confirmed by many reliable witnesses. Now teach these truths to other trustworthy people who will be able to pass them on to others."

He met with me regularly to discuss how things were going, provide encouragement, pray together, and to help me navigate my new calling. I can't imagine anything else that would have been more influential to my growth as a pastor, a husband, a father, and a

follower of Jesus. The time invested in that one-on-one relationship all those years ago continues to make an impact in my life and ministry today.

The concept that Paul lays out to Timothy is not just for pastors! In fact, this past weekend we talked about Jesus's instruction to us in the Great Commission that we are to "go and make disciples." How do we do that? We follow this same model from 2 Timothy 2:2: Take what we have been taught and pass it on to others, who will be able to pass it on to still others.

If you are a follower of Jesus – a disciple – then you are called to make other disciples. Pray about who you can invest in for the future and then begin to look around. Ask God to give you wisdom for who you can help disciple. Then reach out with encouragement and let them know you're going to be praying for them.

Ask if they'd like to get together regularly for encouragement and prayer. If so, try reading the same scripture passages and then discussing them when you're together. Look for opportunities to "teach these truths to other trustworthy people."

When it gets uncomfortable, remember that God rarely calls us to that which is easy. And by pressing forward and "passing it on," you'll be living out Jesus's instructions to go and make disciples!
