ARE YOU #STRUGGLING?

I don't consider myself "old," but the world has changed a lot since I was a kid. In my 43 years I have seen dramatic changes throughout public life. Some of the most impactful have been in the area of technology.

When I was a child, we had a color TV (contrary to my children's jokes), but I do remember when we first received access to cable television. We eventually owned a VCR and learned to record shows so we could watch them later. *Fast-forward to today*: my family's TV programming comes over the internet and we can record everything without ever "changing the tape."

In my lifetime, I have witnessed and experienced the rise of:

- Personal computers (who would ever need that?)
- The internet
- Mobile phones, then *smart* phones
- Social media

When you combine all these advances, the information overload is real! The information that we used to read in the morning newspaper or watch on the evening news is now broadcast/streamed/shouted at us 24 hours a day, every day. Not to mention being able to connect with and watch the lives of hundreds – or thousands – of acquaintances on Facebook or Instagram.

The impact of all this data is daunting. In fact, 64% of Americans currently believe that social media has a "mostly negative" effect on our nation.

Generally speaking, technology is "amoral" – my smartphone by itself is neither good or bad. It can (and

most often does) lead to both positive and negative outcomes, depending on who is using it and how.

This leaves us, as followers of Jesus, to try to live wisely. In our new teaching series, *#STRUGGLES: Following Jesus in a Selfie-Centered World*, we will explore some of the challenges we all face nowadays and be reminded of God's wisdom about topics like contentment, authenticity, relationships, and more.
