

CHARACTER = INTEGRITY

As we continue to move through our *Character Builder* teaching series on Sundays, I thought I'd take a moment to remind you what's at the heart of allowing God to shape and strengthen your character. In short, character is a close synonym of integrity. So far this summer we've looked at the traits of perseverance, commitment, audacity, faithfulness, and responsibility. All of these elements are like ingredients in God's recipe for a life of integrity.

I am reminded and encouraged by King David's prayer in 1 Chronicles 29:17:

"I know, my God, that you examine our hearts and rejoice when you find integrity there. You know I have done all this with good motives, and I have watched your people offer their gifts willingly and joyously."

Each time I read (and re-read) this prayer, I'm specifically struck by the phrase "examine our hearts" in the context of integrity. Being examined for integrity might be an uncomfortable experience for some of us. In fact, I might dare say that each of us probably has *something* that we don't want everyone to know about us.

This idea of an examination for integrity made me think back to when my family and I bought our house. Part of the home buying process included a "home inspection" to check for any underlying issues with the structure, plumbing, or electrical systems in the house. The inspector also checks throughout the house for signs of mold, mildew, and termite damage. The entire process took place to ensure that the investment that my family (and our mortgage company) was making with this house was "sound." And when our prospective home got a clean bill of health, my family and I were both relieved and excited. In a similar way, like we have been discussing throughout this *Character Builder* series, God is building something special of you and I. Ephesians 2 tells us that we are His workmanship, or even His masterpiece. Think of the investment that God has already made in each of us – He created us, loved us in spite of our rebellion, and sent His own Son to pay for our redemption.

Is it any wonder that He "examines our hearts" to check for integrity? He cares deeply about what we become. He loves us beyond measure. And He has made a tremendous investment in our lives. It only makes sense that He would want to inspect the results.

Here are a few questions for you today:

In God's "home inspection" of your life right now, is He finding anything that isn't sound or solid? Are there any habits that – like termites – are eating you up from the inside out? Is there any unconfessed sin hiding in a closet somewhere that needs to be dragged into His light? Are there any grudges you're holding, refusing to forgive someone?

Ask God to help you with your inspection. Then take time to confess, ask His forgiveness, and repent (turn away) from anything that's limiting your integrity.
